I. AMARD OF SOLDIER'S MEDAL. Under the provisions of Army Regulations 600-45, as a unded, a Soldier's Medal is awarded to the following named individual for heroism:

FRED OELSNEH, 32862909, Private First Class, Headquarters Company, 3d Battalion, 141st Infantry Regiment, for heroism on 30 August 1944 in France. When planes strafed the truck on which Private First Class Ocloner and his companions were riding, one of the men was struck by a machine gun bullet which severed an artery in his leg. The truck was set afire, and ammunition loaded on the blazing vehicle began to explode. With no medical personnel available, Private First Class Oelsner fearlessly exposed himself to the exploding ammunition in order to administer emergency treatment to his injured comrade. He applied a tourniquet to his leg and stopped the profuse bleeding. Without a thought for personal safety, he remained with the wounded soldier, attending to his needs, until an subulance arrived to evacuate him. As a result of Private First Class Oelsner's selflessness and courage, the life of his injured comrade was saved. Entered the Service from Jackson Heights, New York.


