I. NAME OF SOLDIER'S NAME. Under the provisions of Army Regulations 600-45, as amended, a Soldier's name is awarded to the following named individuals for service:

WILLIAM D. WALKER, 1940847, Private First Class, Company F, 1st Infantry Regiment, for service on 11 January 1941 in France. When the company entered post trench in fire, four soldiers were trapped in one of the rooms of the burning building. Private Walker ran into the room, grabbed three gas-mask blankets which were burning furiously and dragged them out. Then, despite painful burns on his hands, he ran back through the flames and removed a five-gallon can of gasoline which was in imminent danger of exploding. By his quick thinking and valorous in the face of danger, he saved his comrades and, at the risk of his own life, prevented a tragedy. Entered the Service from Connecticut, U.S.A.
