I. AWARD OF BRONZE STAR MEDAL. 1. Under the provisions of Army Regulations 600-45, as amended, a Bronze Star Medal is awarded to the following named individual for heroic achievement in combat:

WILLARD J. STOLZER, 37187951, Technical Sergeant (then Staff Sergeant), Company M, 143d Infantry Regiment, 20 January 1944, Italy. Entered the Service from Festus, Missouri.
