I. AWARD OF SOLDIER'S MEDAL. Under the provisions of Army Regulations 600-45, as amended, a Soldier's Medal is awarded to the following named individual for heroism:

JOHN J. BISCEGLIE, 33600474, Staff Sergeant, Headquarters Company, 2d Battalion, 141st Infantry Regiment, for heroism on 25 November 1944 in France. Sergeant Bisceglie, with the battalion communications officer, the communications sergeant and a driver, started out from the battalion command post in a jeep to search for a road to the regimental command post. When the vehicle struck an antitank mine in the road, he was severely wounded by the explosion. Although suffering from shock, powder burns and cuts, he mastered the pain of his own injuries in order to assist the seriously injured officer back to the battalion command post. Although he was in urgent need of medical attention, Sergeant Bisceglie insisted upon leading a patrol back to the disabled vehicle, which was a mile away, in order to expedite the evacuation of the driver. He directed the men in lifting the jeep from the driver, who had been pinned beneath it, and supervised his speedy evacuation. Several hours later, after completing his self-imposed mission, Sergeant Bisceglie was evacuated. As a result of his heroic efforts, both the communications officer and the driver received prompt medical attention. Entered the Service from Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.

II. POSTHUMOUS AWARD OF BRONZE STAR MEDAL. Under the provisions of Army Regulations 600-45, as amended, a Bronze Star Medal is posthumously awarded to the following named individual for heroic achievement in combat:
