HISTORICAL DATA FOR MONTH OF MAY 1944

Headquarters Special Troops, 36th Infantry Division, was bivouaced 1 mile northeast of San Prisco, Italy, when the Division was alerted for combat duty on 18 May 1944. A detail of 23 men was sent to the forward CP to assist the movement of Headquarters, Forward, to the "Texas" staging area. Major Walter R. Bruyere III, 022644, was assigned from Personnel Center #9, on further TD as Commanding Officer, Headquarters Company, Forward Echelon, assisted by First Lieutenant Jess W. Jones, 0352136, who was assigned as executive officer.

Under date of 12 May 1944, the Commanding General issued memorandum No. 30, placing all rear elements under direct command of Lt Col J. Trimble Brown, Ol6666, Commanding Officer, Headquarters, 36th Infantry Division, Rear Echelon. At 190920 May 1944, Lt Col Brown accompanied by 1st Lt Walker, Adjutant, and Master Sergeant Long, Sergeant Major, reported to the Chief of Staff for final instructions. Commanding Officers of all Rear Echelon units reported to Commanding Officer, Rear Echelon, at 191030 May 1944 at the Forward CP for instructions relative to their move from the vicinity of Qualiano to San Prisco. Headquarters, 36th Infantry Division, Rear Echelon, at this point consisted of approximately four thousand officers and enlisted men representing the following units and sections:



Captain F. Blackburn, whose regiment (Royal Engineers) was bivousced in an area north of San Prisco, was contacted by Commanding Officer, Rear Echelon, on 20 May 1944 and a plan was formulated Officer, Rear Echelon, on 20 May 1944 and a plan was formulated whereby both American and British forces would police the village of San Prisco, Italy. Civilian barber shops and wine shops were placed

On 241600 May 1944, It Col Brown left by plane from Santa Maria airfield for the forward area, Anzio Beachhead, taking with him personnel roster and vehicle report of all Rear Echelon Units, for the Chief of Staff, and returned 242000. On 241800 May 1944, unit commanders were alerted to have all vehicles, except those essential for their immediate use, to be ready for movement to the "Texas" staging area. All preliminary arrangements having been made, vehicle convoy numbering approximately 700, with maintenance crews passed the IP between 250300 and 250530 May 1944, reaching its destination approximately 250715 May 1944. Due to inadequate cargo space only about 300 vehicles and maintenance crews of the 141st, 142nd and 143rd regiments, were embarked for the Anzio Beachhead. The balance of approximately 400 vehicles with maintenance crews returned to the initial starting point in San Prisco, the last vehicle to return arriving approximately 260600 May 1944. The movement to and return of part of the convoy was performed without report of mishap.


Message received at approximately 262000 May 1944, from Chief of Staff, dated 252200 May 1944, directing that Rotate replacements reserves in the rear echelon be sent to the forward area by the most expeditious means as soon as possible, was already being complied with.

On 261800 May 1944, Directive No. 33, was dispatched by Head-quarters, 36th Infantry Division, Rear Echelon, to commanders of the remaining units relating to movement to the "Texas" staging area. The control of the term of



Major Robert L. O'Brien, 0308359, CT, 143rd Infantry, was in charge of the movement, which was completed without report of mishap.

On 271100 May 1944, details to be attended to relative to convoy overland movement via Route 7 to the forward area at Cisterna, Italy, were taken care of by Division Headquarters, and Headquarters Special Troops, 36th Infantry Division. At 271400 May 1944, Lt Col Brown, accompanied by 1st Lt Charles W. Walker, 0442455, and an advance detail party of enlisted men left the San Prisco area for the forward area over Route #7, in order to make a reconnaissance of the new bivouac area. En route, the advance detail group was billeted near the roads of Highway #7, and Terracina at 261800 May 1944. It Col Brown, 1st It Walker, Cpl Scullane, 1st Lt Anderson, and Pvt Dillard, continued on their mission to Cisterna. Upon arrival at their destination, Lt Col Brown found the area untenable and too close to the enemies' artillery range to maintain the security of the Division Rear Echelon. With permission of the Chief of Staff, VI Corps, an area was selected approximately 3 miles east of Nettuno. The evening of 27 May 1944, Cisterna was heavily bombed and shelled by enemy forces. The wooded hilly area east of Highway #7 was also infested with enemy snipers, not yet cleared out by our own forces, thus making it more hazardous for Special Units to establish their base as formerly contemplated. It Col Brown was in the area while the bombing and shelling took place in and about Cisterna. There was a great deal of flak from our AA guns.

Headquarters, Special Troops, consisting of the Adjutant General's Section, Finance Section, Surgeon's Section, Special Service, Special Troops Personnel Section, Enlisted Mess Personnel, Inspector General's Section, Judge Advocate Section, Chaplain's Section, 36th Infantry Division Band, and Unit Personnel Sections, left the San Prisco area in three groups. The first convoy left the area at 280400 May 1944, one at 281100 May 1944, and the third convoy left at 281330 May 1944. Transportation was furnished by British lories through the 5th Army. The convoy travelled overland on Route #7 to Santa Maria, northwest to Capua, to Sessa, to Minturno, to Formia, to Itri, to Fondi, to Terracina, over the Pontine Marshes, to approximately two miles southeast of Cisterna, where the convoy proceeded west to the bivouac area east of Nettuno. The last vehicle of the convoy reached the new area at approximately 282100 May 1944. The personnel of the units moved into dugouts previously prepared and occupied by the Division Forward CP. The movement was accomplished without incident. Units of Division Rear Echelon, not

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
provided with cover, dug in for the night. Sections were dispersed and full advantage was taken of natural camouflage. Blackout regulations were enforced and guards posted around the area. The enemy defensive position at this time was at Albano, Velletri, Highway #7, approximately 12 miles north of Cisterna. The following day, 29 May 1944, the various units of Headquarters Special Troops improved their dugouts, camouflaged their areas, and telephone connections were made with Robert Forward. Small bands of enemy forces were reported as operating behind our front lines. The need for added guard protection was apparent and the units were alerted against any enemy infiltration into the Rear Echelon Area. At 311000 May 1944, Chief of Staff, G4, VI Corps, directed that Headquarters Special Troops move into a more compact area in order to provide room for two combat units of the 5th Army to bivouac adjacent to our own area. Personnel sections vacated their area by 10800 June 1944.


There were no casualties during the period 18 May 1944, to 31 May 1944. No replacements were received during this period.

Other routine matters were attended to by the Commanding Officer. All enlisted men and officers were fed at the time pre-arranged. All operations were performed tactically in the combat area. 
