TANK J. NOVALLI, 38050988, Technician Fifth Grade, Headquarters Company, 636th Tank Destroyer Battalion, 18 March 1944. Entered the Service from Galveston, Texas.

SECTION III -- COMMENDATION FOR EXCEPTIONALLY MERITORIOUS CONDUCT

Under the provisions of Army regulations 600-55, the following named individual is commended for exceptionally meritorious conduct.

PAUL KURILICHICK, 32165397, Corporal, Personnel Center #9, FBS, for exceptionally meritorious conduct on 30 May 1944 in Italy. When it was essential to locate the 36th Provisional Pack Troop and guide it to the division sector, Corporal Kurilichick volunteered for the hazardous mission. Starting out at dusk, he trailed the troop for six miles, following it through darkness across a mountain. Because the regular trails were subjected to artillery and sniper fire, he was forced to move over unfamiliar terrain. In spite of the hostile fire and the rugged, mountainous terrain, he and a companion succeeded in locating the troop in a minimum of time, successfully completing the mission. Entered the Service from South River, New Jersey.

SECTION IV -- CORRECTED POSTHUMOUS AWARD OF BRONZE STAR MEDAL

So much of General Orders Number 343, cs, this Headquarters, as posthumously awards a Bronze Star Medal to Staff Sergeant MALCOLM L. PERRAULT, 1425282, Hq Co, 2d Battalion, 141st Infantry Regiment, is rescinded and the following substituted therefor.
