FAUL KURILICHICK, 32165397, Corporal, Personnel Center #9, FBS, for exceptionally meritorious conduct on 30 May 1944 in Italy. Then it was essential to locate the 36th Provisional Pack Troop and guide it to the division sector, Corporal nurilichick volunteered for the hazardous mission. Starting out at dusk, he trailed the troop for six miles, following it through darkness across a mountain. Because the regular trails were subjected to artillery and sniper fire, he was forced to move over unfamiliar terrain. In spite of the hostile fire and the rugged, mountainous terrain, he and a companion succeeded in locating the troop in a minimum of time, successfully completing the mission. Entered the Service from south kiver, New Jersey.
