

SUBJECT: "OPERATIONS IN FRANCE AND GERMANY."

TO : Commanding General, 36th Infantry Division, APO #36, U. S. Army.

1. Transmitted herewith Historical Data of the 11th Medical Battalion for the month of March 1945.

2. Operations during the first half of the period were confined to holding and patrolling. Casualties were light and evacuation presented no difficulties. The latter half of the period was marked by participation in a large scale offensive, attacking across a river into strongly held positions. Resistance was stubborn. Heavily mined areas produced fairly heavy casualties, as was expected. Once this belt was passed the operation accelerated and the well-defended Haguenau Forest sector fell to the flanking movements.

3. Weather conditions were not adverse. Evacuation presented no unusual difficulties. In the high ground of the Siegfried Line, litter hauls were arduous and long. Infantry medical detachments were understrength, and battalion litter bearers had to be assisted by personnel from Army collecting companies. Such additional assistance was employed for a 48 hour period, greatly speeding up evacuation to aid stations. These Army litter bearers performed in a highly satisfactory manner. Attached field hospital units gave close support. Movement of these units was by medical battalion vehicles augmenting field hospital facilities. Often valuable time is lost in moving surgical units when only medical battalion vehicles are available.

4. Medical supplies were ample, well packaged, and careful planning had provided adequate stocks in each installation.

5. Motor vehicle operation was very satisfactory. During the preceding period of relative quiet, vehicles had had thorough processing. Constant preventive maintenance is essential. Tires are getting badly worn and punctures are more frequent.

111th MEDICAL BATTALION

MARCH 1945

The first two weeks of the month were spent in holding positions similar in location to those of the previous month.

On the 15th day of the month, the Division participated in an offensive designed to clear the enemy from the triangular pocket west of the Rhine River. The clearing station remained originally at Stephansfeld, and preparations were made to move a platoon to vicinity of Haguenau or Pfaffenoffen depending on how the situation developed. On the second day of the offensive, a platoon moved to vicinity of Pfaffenoffen. One platoon remained in operation at Stephansfeld to process patients from vicinity of Haguenau where progress was slower than on the left flank.

As the flanking movement developed from the left, and with the capture of Surbourg when all troops continued northeast, the clearing platoon at Stephansfeld closed and moved to Surbourg. The platoon supporting the flanking movement from the left closed and was prepared to displace forward on short notice.

The majority of the seriously wounded patients during the first two days of the offensive was a result of the heavily mined areas encountered in the enemy's main defense line.

With the exception of three days required for the penetration of the Siegfried Line, all units of the battalion maintained good offensive positions throughout the operation as the troops continued northeast to Bergzabern and eastward to the western bank of the Rhine River.

Evacuation by ambulance from the aid stations to the clearing station was accomplished with ease over good evacuation routes. Long difficult litter hauls were encountered in the mountains north of Wissembourg during the attack on the Siegfried Line. Additional litter bearers were employed for a period of 48 hours after which they were no longer necessary.

On the 20th of March all units were withdrawn from the combat area to an area for refitting and rehabilitation.
