SUBJECT: "OPERATIONS IN FRANCE."

- : Commanding General, 36th Infantry Division, APO #36, U.S. Army.
- 1. Transmitted herewith Historical Bata of the 111th Medical Battal-TO ion for the month of February 1945.
- 2. During the period, the Division was committed only to limited objectives and defensive operations, necessitating less frequent moves for supporting medical installations. The most difficult evacuation problem resulted from the action involved in the capture of a town, strongly defended and necessitating a river crossing. Evacuation was by quarter ton trucks, equipped with litter racks, and by litter hauls to an ambulance loading post located as far forward as the action permitted.
- 3. The melting snow, with flooding of areas made evacuation fairly difficult early in the period. Thawing, with heavy military traffic, reduced the roads to difficult trails, necessitating one way routes. Very little rain fell during the period and evacuation gradually became easier. Evacuation by rmy was very satisfactory, although roads in bad repair made ambulance trips tedious. The attached field hospital was established in an adjacent building.
- 4. The clearing station and attached field hospital were able to operate entirely in buildings, During the latter half of the period, the rear platoon moved up in close preximity to the forward station, eperating as a holding station. Casualty processing and also holding were accomplished by the forward platoon, is westher conditions improved, a shower was established nearby, for benefit of patients and battalion personnel. Enlisted barbers served as many patients as time permitted. / small building was converted to a theater, and movies were shown to such hospitalized personnel as were able to attend. Them adequate housing is available, and moves are infrequent, the establishment of showers, special service entertainment, and purber service is feasible and of great benefit as a rehabilitation
 - 5. The Division dental presthetic service completed 55 insertions, measure, which included full dentures, partial dentures and repairs. This is accomplished with minimum loss of time from duty by the patient. Orthopedic,





ophthalmological and other types of consultations are accomplished by transperting patients to evacuation hospitals, and having them return the same day. Replacement of broken spectacles, from prescriptions recorded, is accomplished by the Division Medical Supply.

- 6. Medical supply was very satisfactory. No critical shortages occurred, stocks were maintained well, and weather conditions did not affect supplies adversely.
- 7. Motor maintenance was gratifying. Excellent working sonditions during the latter half of the period enabled motor sections to make repairs, 6000-mile checks, and repaint many of the vehicles. The supply of GMC parts was adquate, and fortunately the need of such parts was small. The supply of Didge parts was more ample, and fortunately the majority of medical battalion vehicles are of Dodge manufacture. The bell crank and left torque reaction spring of the quarter ton truck needed frequent replacement. These parts are subjected to extreme wear in operation over worn out roads.
- 8. A Straining program was instituted near the end of the period. Particular stress was put on chemical warfare.



The greater part of the month was devoted to holding operations with two regiments committed and the other in reserve. Several offensives, two regimental strength, were launched early in the month to sieze each of regimental strength, were launched early in the month to sieze limited objectives. There were no unusual difficulties in evacuation of casualties.

A battalion training program was initiated during the third week of the month stressing the proper handling, treatment, evacuation of gas casualties, and arrangements of collecting and clearing stations for efficualties, and arrangements of collecting and clearing memorandum is attached. ient care of gas casualties. I copy of the training memorandum is attached.

Collecting companies were withdrawn to rest areas with infantry regiments to which they were attached.


The clearing company remained in buildings in a civilian hespital area at Stephansfeld throughout the period. Facilities for showers and exchange of clothing were provided.

During the night 13-14 February, fifteen (15) enemy shells, of estimated 380mm, landed in Brumath; approximately one kilometer from the clearing station. There were no military casualties and only one civilian casualty as a result of this shelling.



BATTALION TRAINING PROGRAM

- l. Training will be conducted by all units and programs will include certain subjects as set forth in this directive. Company commanders will zation. Inspections will be made to insure that training has been organischeduling no class for instruction in which the leader has not had ample satisfactory manner.
- 2. The training day (six (6) days per week) will consist of six (6) hours, as fellows:

0900A - 1145A 1300A - 1545A

Retreat inspection - 1/2 hour

- 3. This Training Memorandum is continuous and becomes effective this
- 4. Unit commanders will submit a copy of their programs to this head-
- 5. In addition to 'on-the-job training', the following will be included:
 - (1) Disciplinary Drill. Two (2) hours weekly, given in short periods of instruction, to include calisthenics, close order drill, etc.
 - (2) Security (Two (2) hours weekly).
- 6. Physical Conditioning. 1/2 hour of calisthenics or other physical exercise conducted daily. Whenever practicable, organized athletics may be scheduled for this purpose.
 - 7. Disciplinary Training. A sense of discipline will be instilled by:
 - (a) Requiring exact obedience to all orders by all ranks.
 (b) Requiring inspections, drill, and other training designed to demand exact execution by the soldier.

Daily first-echelon motor maintenance.

- 8. Medical Training. 1/2 hour daily should be alloted the following subjects:
 - Treatment of gas casualties (Companies "A", "B", "C" & "D" Gas decontamination of clothing and equipment especially

ambulances, (All companies), Selection of evacuation routes by litter and ambulance, (Companies "A" B" & "C"

9. To improve the quality of the leader and instill a sense of discipline and confidence in the men toward their leader, it is necessary to concentrate training effort in the leader (Officer or NCO) while accomplishing the most possible training for the men. A training period for the leaders should accomplish the following minimum results.

Increase the leaders basic knowledge.

Make the leader aware of his responsibilities.

Increase the leaders self-confidence in his ability and knowledge.

10. Unit commanders will instruct junior officer and non-commissioned officer instructors in the following subjects:

> Responsibilities and duties of junior officers and noncommissioned officers.

Security.

Conservation of materiel.

Sanitation and health.

11. Service calls for the collecting companies will be as prescribed by their respective regimental commanders. Headquarters Detachment and Company "D" will comply with the following service calls:


